

4. REMAIN PATIENT

If a child is struggling with their emotions, it can often become difficult to stay calm. Remember that dysregulation is beyond their control, so a display of frustration or anger could negatively impact the situation. Instead, children need to be met with comfort and understanding to help them manage these problematic feelings.

National Online Safety - Teaching children to self-regulate online Children need to learn to understand and recognise their emotions, while

finding healthy ways to process them. Emotional self-regulation depends heavily on age and development and nurturing these important skills can be hugely beneficial.

This is the fourth of the top ten tips for supporting children with their self-regulation.
