Rocksteady

Next term we are very lucky to have 'Rocksteady' join us in school, to teach children how to play a musical instrument and be part of a band. Learning an instrument should be fun. Your child can choose from the electric guitar, keyboard, drums or vocals and enjoy playing in a happy, supportive environment with their friends. The Rocksteady Programme is for all children aged 4-11 and is proven to progress musicianship, confidence and teamwork skills with no prior experience necessary. The programme is lead by real musicians who know how to inspire a life-long love of playing music. To explain more about this programme, including cost of lessons, we would like to invite you to an assembly with Rocksteady on Friday 19th April at 9AM.

Trim Trail

On Monday, members of the Trust's sites and maintenance team and a play equipment specialist visited to review the current situation with our trim trail and begin developing plans for the future. They first reiterated that our current equipment is no longer safe to use. However, they spoke positively about potential options and will shortly present proposals for what could be done to either repair or replace the equipment. We will then be able to make our own decision on what we think is best and financially viable. I intend to discuss this with the children too to hear their views before we make a decision. It may be that we will also need to look to do some additional fundraising depending on what we decide we would like to do. Once I know more I will update you again. Many thanks again for your patience and understanding as we look to provide the best we can for all the children at Trannack.

Residential

Taking Holiday in Term Time

Last year's attendance for the whole school was just 91.6%, which is extremely low. The national average is 97%, which is also the expectation in this school. You have a legal duty to make sure your child attends school regularly and punctually. The school and the Local Authority monitor your child's attendance and will take action if it is poor. The Government recommends that family holidays are taken outside of school terms. Headteachers will sometimes give permission for a pupil to go on holiday during term time. They will consider the reasons for the holiday, the pupil's past attendance, and the effects the absence will have on the pupil's learning. But will not normally give permission simply because holidays cost less during term time. Headteachers have the discretion to grant leave, but they should only do so in exceptional circumstances. If a head teacher grants a leave request, it will be for them to determine the length of time that the child can be away from school. It is, however, unlikely to be granted for the purposes of a family holiday. Parents can be fined for taking their child on holiday during term time without consent from the school.

Warning - If you take your child out of school without permission you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may refer the matter to the education Welfare Service who may decide to prosecute. A conviction may result in a

fine of up to £2,500, a prison sentence of up to three months or both. Alternatively, a penalty notice may be issued, this carries a fine of £60 per child if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the penalty notice will result in Court action.



There are some wonderful books that can help you teach self-regulation to children. Reading these with a child can be especially powerful. Take time to discuss the content: ask questions about what feelings the characters had, why they felt that way and what strategies helped them. It can also be useful to refer back to snippets of these books at appropriate moments.

National Online Safety - Teaching children to self-regulate online

Children need to learn to understand and recognise their emotions, while finding healthy ways to process them. Emotional self-regulation depends heavily on age and development and nurturing these important skills can be hugely beneficial.

This is the sixth of the top ten tips for supporting children with their self-regulation.
