## National Child Measurement Programme, Routine Vision and Hearing Screening

At this time of year that the local authority undertake the National Child Measurement Programme in schools, for children in Reception and Yr6. There are two links below, one is for the parents of children in Reception and the other one for parents of children in Yr6. Additional to the height & weight checks children in reception have their vision screened and the same children, once they reach Yr1, have their hearing screened.
