This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

## Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

- Our music curriculum can be found on the school website.
- It is inclusive for all learners through methods of adaptive teaching.
- Our aim is for all children to access a sequence of progressive lessons of quality music within each term.
- Kapow is used within our school, which uses the National Curriculum at the heart of its inspiring program of study.
- Children have the opportunity to sing within lessons, in the Christmas production and in assemblies.
- Children in the EYFS have 'nursery rhyme time' everyday.
- There is a regular singing assembly to introduce new songs and build upon existing ones.

- During Autumn term 2, the children all participate in a whole school Christmas production, consisting of acting, singing and dancing.

## Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

- Music specialist teachers from Rocksteady Music School offer the opportunity for children to learn to play the keyboard, drums, guitar and sing. This is paid for by parents.
- An after-school music club is run for one term over the year. This is free to attend.

## Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

- Last year, the children have been involved in various musical experiences. They attended a live performance of 'Jolly Roger's Christmas' at the life and light centre in Helston.
- All children attended a live Rocksteady launch concert.
- This year we are planning to attend more events through ASONE and will be researching what opportunities are available locally for the children to experience live musical performances.

## In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

- We aim to set up a school choir this year.
- We aim to have First Access set up to teach children in KS2 an instrument for a term.
- We aim to get our younger children involved in CMST Key Stage 1 inspiration project.
- We plan to have three concerts a year for parents for those children who learn an instrument through Rocksteady Music School.
- We plan to continue to provide opportunities for the children to enjoy live music.

- During school singing assemblies, we plan to build upon those in KS2 who can play an instrument, providing the musical accompaniment.
