- Trannack’s Christmas Cinema



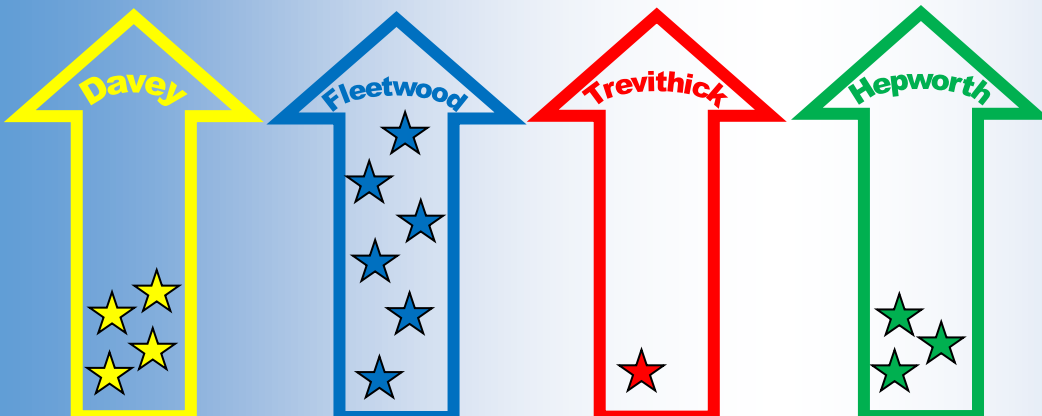

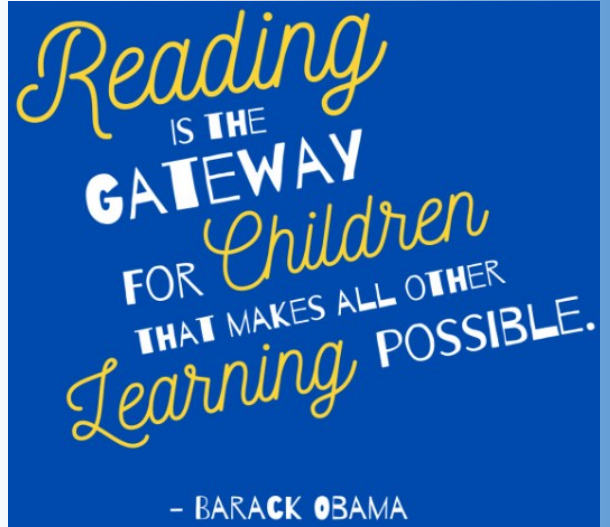




Stuff to know when you start school - DK


