

Churchill's VE Day speech and clips about evacuees and the Wrens. They also did guided reading, colouring and made posters relating to the event.


Mrs May took an assembly, we looked at one of the old school log books, and found some of the past Trannack pupils from 1944 who were evacuees and had been sent down to live with local families.
