

Dear Parents/Carers

Welcome Back - We are pleased to be able to welcome Mr Boyes back to school. He was in this week every morning and will be increasing his time with us gradually each week.

Sports Day - Weather permitting this will be taking place at 1:30pm on Friday 4th July. Children are invited to wear a t-shirt in their team colour on that day. If children don't have anything in their team colour they can wear a bib from school. Please ensure that they have plenty of water in their drink bottles, a hat, suncream and coat should the weather be colder than it is currently.

Sports Day - Help Required - We have 2 large tents for shade/shelter that require a few bodies to put up on the playing field. 


