The total cost of acquiring this type of equipment is considerable (between £10,000-£20,000). We have applied for lottery funding but need to make some amendments to our application before trying again. Unfortunately, this is a slow process! However, we would like to look at other ways to raise funds for this, such as through and sponsorship events that we plan to hold throughout the year. The children had great fun making chocolate cookies last night. They also learnt about weighing and measuring the ingredients.













The Genius of the Anglo-Saxons by Izzi Howell


